Born in 1986, Vito di Battista works as a literary agent and translator. He lived in Florence, where he graduated in Comparative Literature with a study on the works of Romain Gary, Tarjei Vesaas, and J.M. Barrie. Then he moved to Alma Mater Studiorum in Bologna, focusing on American and English poetry. He wrote about Ted Hughes and Romain Gary for the literary magazine *Nuovi Argomenti* (issued by Mondadori). His first novel, *L'ultima diva dice addio*, was published in 2018 by SEM and was shortlisted for several awards. His second book, *Il buon uso della distanza*, is out with Gallucci in November 2023. After reading just a one-chapter sample, Feltrinelli Editore acquired the Italian rights to his next novel, with a publication planned for early 2025.

Meanwhile, his life becomes entangled with those who, to varying degrees of awareness, are part of his shadowy career: Colette, the madam of an illegal brothel chosen by Madame as her direct spokesperson; Philippe, Pierre's only true friend; Louis, an enigmatic and captivating young man with whom Pierre reluctantly falls in love; and Philippe's girlfriend Claire, an aspiring actress who is the only one to understand that what 'many call a gift is actually a life-long sentence.' It is to Claire that, after years of deceiving everyone and concealing parts of his life, Pierre finally reveals the whole truth. On that fateful day in 1976, when everything began, he had no idea that Madame harbored her own hidden agenda. An agenda fueled by resentment and family secrets that would ultimately shatter Pierre's life.

In the 1940s, Cicely made a decision that many considered unconventional. Instead of completing her degree at Oxford University, she chose to become a nurse because she felt a strong calling to help her country during the war. Her classmates at the prestigious Nightingale Nursery School often teased her for her clumsiness, partly due to scoliosis, and her unfashionable hairstyle. Despite the challenges, she earned her nursing diploma but soon realized that her back pain would prevent her from pursuing her dream. Undeterred, she enrolled in a social work course.

While working at St. Thomas Hospital, Cicely unexpectedly found herself falling in love with David, a terminally ill patient from Poland. Their relationship lasted less than two months, but it helped Cicely conceive the idea of a home-hospital—a place where the terminally ill, often deemed unrecoverable and neglected by the healthcare system, could receive compassionate care.

During her free time, Cicely volunteered at St. Luke's, a hospital run by nuns. Here, she crossed paths with the rebellious Sister Teresa and learned the significance of administering small, regular doses of opiates to bring comfort to her dying patients. She realized that to accomplish her goals, she needed to become a doctor.

At the age of 33, Cicely graduated as a doctor and began her research on pain management for cancer patients. She fell in love with Antoni, who, once again, was Polish and terminally ill. This time, her heart was shattered. She contemplated leaving everything behind, but doing so would mean abandoning her patients just as her dreams were beginning to take shape. In 1967, the St. Christopher Hospice was inaugurated, and Cicely's dream became a reality.

Born in 1971, Veronica Galletta worked as a mechanical engineer for many years before dedicating herself exclusively to her writing. In 2015, her unpublished novel, *Le isole di Norman*, was shortlisted for the 'Italo Calvino' prize, the most renowned and reputable Italian contest for aspiring writers, which has launched the careers of authors like Marcello Fois and Paola Mastrocola. Finally published in April 2020 by Italo Svevo, *Le isole di Norman* won the prestigious '**Premio Campiello' for debut novel** less than two months later, with a unanimous vote. This award is the most prestigious and important in Italy for debut novels and new authors. Her second novel, *Nina sull'argine*, was published in October 2021 by minimum fax and was shortlisted for the '**Premio Strega**' in 2022, one of Italy's most esteemed literary awards. In the same year, it also received the 'Premio Letteratura d'Impresa.' Her latest novel, "Pelleossa," is out in October 2023.

Claudio Morandini, a high school teacher residing in Aosta, is an accomplished writer with works that include radio plays, theater monologues, and numerous novels. His book *A gran giornate* won the "Città di Trebisacce" Literary Prize in 2013. His short story *Dita fredde* is included in *Santi – Lives of Modern Saints* (Black Arrow Press, USA, 2007).

In August 2018, Salani published his first children's book, Le maschere di Pocacosa.

Neve, *cane*, *piede*, his most famous novel, has been a true literary phenomenon: a top 5 best-seller, it won the 'Premio Procida-Elsa Morante-Isola di Arturo' in 2016, with translations rights sold to 8 Countries so far. A new expanded edition has been published in June 2021 by Bompiani as part of "Le Finestre", a series of novels by "great Italian authors".

The French paperback of *Le chien*, *la neige*, *un pied* won the 'Prix Lire en Poche de littérature traduite' (2021). In 2022, *Snow*, *dog*, *foot* was shortlisted for the 'John Florio Prize' in the UK, and in 2023 the Dutch edition *Sneeuw*, *hond*, *voet* was a finalist for the 'Europese Literatuurprijs'.

His new novel is out in October 2023 with nottetempo.





HELGA SCHNEIDER

Born in 1937 in Silesia, which was part of the Third Reich at the time, Helga Schneider's life is a novel itself.

Abandoned by her mother in 1941, she finds out only three decades later that the woman was still alive and had left the family to work in the SS as a guardian in Auschwitz-Birkenau. Schneider told this story in her best-selling novel Lasciami andare, madre (Let me go), published in 2004 by Adelphi and translated into several languages.

A biopic based on the book was released in 2017 and premiered at the Edinburgh International Film Festival.

She later published two more novels with Adelphi and others with Einaudi, Rizzoli, and Salani.

In 1996 she won the "Premio Rapallo", and in 2015 she received the 'Premio Ceppo' Lifetime Achievement Award for her children's books.

Her latest novel, Watching Bismarckstraße, out with Solferino (RCS Group) in the Fall of 2023, opens with a specific event that took place in 1944, with Helga and her brother Peter meeting Adolf Hitler in his bunker as part of a project by the Reich's Ministry of Propaganda.

Schneider has been living in Bologna since 1963.

He is a two-time finalist of Premio Calvino, the most important award in Italy for unpublished authors. The prize launched the careers of several esteemed writers, including Veronica Galletta (winner of Premio Campiello Opera Prima award and finalist at Premio Strega), represented by Otago Literary Agency. *La Cantadora* is Vanni Lai's debut novel.




